Mr. Gwin, from the Committee on Naval Affairs, reported the following bill; which was read and passed to a second reading.

## A Bill

For the relief of Julia Acken

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Commissioner of Pensions be, and is hereby directed to allow to Julia Acken, the only child of William Yool, who died in the naval service of the United States, in the year eighteen hundred and one, the pension she would have been entitled to receive under the provisions of the first section of the act of third March, eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, providing for the more equitable administration of the navy pension fund, if her claim had been allowed by the Secretary of the Navy while that act was in force.
