Death of Mr. Joseph Adams

The death of Joseph Adams, the active and efficient teller of the Bank of Washington, and son of James Adams, Esq., for many years cashier of that bank, was announced yesterday to his numerous friends, causing general sorrow. Mr. Adams had previously been unwell with pneumonia, but had recovered. On the 22d of February he took cold from exposure that day, and again recovered sufficiently to resume his duties at the bank, and he was in his office until Wednesday. He was again taken sick, and his disease proved to be the typhoid fever, which resulted fatally yesterday. Mr. Adams was highly esteemed by his large circle of acquaintances. The loss will be deeply felt by the bank, as it will be no easy matter to fill the position with one as competent to perform all the duties. In consequence of his death, the bank is closed today.
