A Representative from Mass.; born in Greenwich, Mass.; April 14, 1808; completed preparatory studies and was graduated from Dartmouth College, Hanover, N.H., in 1827; studied law; was admitted to the bar in 1830 and commenced the practice of his profession in Greenfield, Mass.; member of the State house of representatives in 1837; served in the state Senate in 1838; elected as a Whig to the 26th Congress and served from March 4, 1839 until his death before the Congress assembled, in Greenfield, Franklin County, Mass.; on September 27, 1839; interment in Federal Street Cemetery.
