A native of Washington, D.C., she was born at 470 N st. sw., in the house which was later known as the Barney Neighborhood House. She had lived in Purcellville with her son for the last 26 years. While in Washington she was a member of the Episcopal Church of the Advent.

In addition to her son, she is survived by three daughters, Helen Ball, Capitola Dresden and Augusta Dolson, all of 3000 Connecticut ave. nw.

Mrs. Capitola Eugene Anderson, 101, mother of Mayor Albert Frank Anderson of Purcellville, died yesterday at Cloptons Nursing Home in Paeonian Springs. She had been a patient at the home for four weeks.

Mrs. Anderson was the widow of Albert Edward Anderson, a one-time employe of the Post Office in Washington. He died in 1916.

A native of Washington, Mrs. Anderson was born at 470 N street S.W. in the house later known as the Barney Neighborhood House. Her parents were the late Adolph and Loraine Lippard.

She had lived in Purcellville with her son and his family for 26 years. While in Washington, she was a member of the Episcopal Church of the Advent.
