Was Clerk in Office of the Chief of Engineers

Mrs. Lucy E. Anderson, clerk in the office of the chief of engineers, died yesterday morning at her home on Buchanan street. She had been in ill health for some time.

Mrs. Anderson was appointed to the War Department, December 24, 1886, from Delphi, Ind. She was the widow of Lieut. William Anderson, who served in the Indiana volunteers in the civil war. At one time she served as Washington correspondent for the New York Clipper. She leaves four brothers, Rear Admiral George W. Pigman, retired, of Annapolis; James and George Pigman of Chicago, and Charles Pigman of Indianapolis; two sisters, Mrs. Charles Pollard of Delphi, Ind., and Mrs. Belle Dewey of Chicago, and one son, Jim P. Anderson of this city.
