Funeral -- Yesterday afternoon, the funeral of the late Samuel H. Bailey took place from his late residence, on Capitol Hill, and it was very largely attended, Columbia Lodge, No. 10, I.O.O.F., headed by Heald's Washington Brass Band, and Eagle Tent of Rechabites being present as organizations, as also a large number of the workmen employed by the city passenger railway, the companions of the deceased. The remains were taken to the East Washington Methodist Church, where the funeral discourse was delivered by Rev. George V. Leech, the pastor, (the congregation being a very large one,) and at its close the procession moved to the Congressional Cemetery, where the remains were interred with the services of the order.
