Miss Laura Bangs Dies

Had Been Clerk in Pension Office for About Thirty-Five Years

Miss Laura Bangs, a clerk in the pension office for about thirty-five years, died suddenly Wednesday at her apartments in the Plymouth apartment house. Funeral services are to be conducted tomorrow morning at 11 o'clock in her apartments. Interment is to be in Congressional cemetery.

Miss Bangs was the daughter of the late James C. and Mary Gormley Bangs, long-time residents of the District. For many years she was the soloist of the Mount Vernon M.E. Church South. She is survived by three brothers, David C. Bangs of Chicago, William T. Bangs of Denver and Gale C.W. Bangs of Salem, Ore., and by two sisters, Mrs. L.A. Bremermann of Chicago and Mrs. Gertrude Butts of this city.
