Isabelle Barton, 86, a life-long area resident who ran her own information service before retiring about 1950, died Sunday at the Wisconsin Avenue Nursing Home in Washington after a stroke.

She owned and operated the Nixon Information Service, which supplied news on government affairs, for about 15 years.

Mrs. Barton had been a member of the Washington, and Twentieth Century clubs and the Audubon Society.

She was born in Washington and was a graduate of the old Business High School. She resided in the District of Columbia at the time of her death.

Her first husband, Charles Nixon, died in the late 1940s.

Mrs. Barton is survived by her husband, Walter E. Barton of Washington, and a sister, Imogene C. Stockett, also of Washington.
