Rothwell Brown's Daughter Given in Marriage by Brother

The wedding of Miss Paula Churchill Brown, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Rothwell Brown, of Washington, to Mr. George Allen Bell, jr., son of Mrs. George Allen Bell, of Reading, Pa., will take place today in Kobe, Japan. The ceremony, an informal one, will be performed by the American Consul.

Lieut. Rothwell H. Brown, brother of the bride, will be the best man, and will also give his sister in marriage.

Mr. and Mrs. Bell will remain in Japan for one week, after which they will proceed to Tientsin, China, where they will make their home for the next 2-1/2 years. Mr. Bell is a representative of the Standard Oil Co., in the district of north China.

A romance of the Far East culminated yesterday in Kobe, Japan, with the marriage of Miss Paula Churchill Brown, daughter of a Washington newspaper man, and George Allen Bell, jr., son of Mrs. George Allen Bell, of Reading, Pa., it was learned here last night.

The bride and bridegroom met last year when Miss Brown went to Tientsin, China, to visit her brother, Lieut. Rothwell H. Brown, U.S.A. Mr. Bell is representative of the Standard Oil Co. of New York, in the north China district.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Rothwell Brown, of this city. Her father has been identified for many years with Washington newspapers. She was given in marriage by her brother.

Following a brief wedding trip through Japan, the couple will make their home in Tientsin, China. The bride completed her education in the Corcoran Art School here, and the New York School of Fine and Applied Arts. She also studied in Paris. Mr. Bell is a graduate of Dartmouth.
