Death of Spanish War Veteran

Dr. William D. Bell, an officer of the volunteer army during the Spanish war died suddenly in New York city yesterday morning. He was the son of the late General George Bell, U.S. Army and of Mrs. George Bell of 1915 G street.

Funeral services will be held at the residence of his mother in this city tomorrow afternoon. Since the Spanish War, Dr. Bell had engaged in the practice of medicine in New York city.
