Mrs. Beyer, Injured in Crash, Dies

Funeral services for Nellie A. Beyer, 89, widow of Andrew J. Beyer who operated one of the last private farms in Washington, will be held Friday.

Mrs. Beyer died at Hadley Memorial Hospital Tuesday night of injuries suffered in an automobile accident November 10.

Prince Georges County police said she was a passenger in a car driven by her niece, Mrs. Maude G. Hobbs, with whom she lived in Seat Pleasant. The accident occurred at 65th ave. and Buchanan st., Maryland Park, when Mrs. Hobbs' auto and a truck collided.

A prayer is scheduled to be said for Mrs. Beyer at 9:30 a.m. Friday at her old home at 4621 Nichols ave. sw. Mass will be celebrated at St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Congress Heights at 10 a.m. Burial will follow at Congressional Cemetery.

The Hadley Memorial Hospital at 4601 Nichols ave. sw., where Mrs. Beyer died, is located on land which was once part of her husband's farm. Mr. Beyer sold the farm in 1946 after operating it for more than 50 years. He died in 1947.

Although Mrs. Beyer still considered the house at 4621 Nichols ave. sw., her home, for the past year she had lived with her niece.

A native Washingtonian, Mrs. Beyer would have been 90 years old on New Year's Day. She is survived by 13 nieces and nephews.
