Francis G. Boswell, 80, a retired patent lawyer, died of a heart attack Tuesday at his home, 3446 Brown st. nw.

A native of Washington, he was a graduate of the Bliss Electrical School. Although he never attended law school, Mr. Boswell was admitted to the D.C. bar and to practice before the Supreme Court and the Virginia Supreme Court. He retired from his practice in the Denrike Building about a year ago.

Mr. Boswell's extensive law library was open to other lawyers in the building and he often gave free legal advice to service personnel there.

A music lover, he had composed several pieces, among them "The Bliss Electrical School March."

Surviving are his wife, Grace Taylor, and a stepdaughter, Mrs. Henry D. Sanders.
