Mr. James Boswell, a fireman of the Baltimore and Potomac railroad, who, on Friday evening, was badly scalded by steam from an engine standing in the yard on Virginia Avenue, near South Capitol street, died yesterday morning at Providence hospital from the effects of his injuries. The deceased was 24 years old, a native of South Washington. His funeral will take place from the residence of his brother-in-law, No. 1719 5th street northwest, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.
