Walter J. Boyce Dies At Fraternal Home

Veteran Pharmacist, 73, Was Native of District -- Funeral Monday

Walter J. Boyce, 73 years old, veteran pharmacist, died in the Masonic and Eastern Star Home yesterday from angina pectoris.

Born in this city, Mr. Boyce was the son of the late James A. and Julia A. Boyce. He began the study of medicine and at the age of 16 entered the drug business with A.J. Schaffert, remaining there 23 years. Subsequently he became one of the founders of the pharmacy in Children's Hospital and was widely known and consulted by the leading pharmacists of this city.

He was a member of Potomac Lodge No. 5, F.A.A.M., Eureka Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, and of Miriam Chapter, O.E.S.

Funeral services will be conducted in the S.H. Hines Co. funeral home, 2901 Fourteenth street, Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery, with Masonic rites at the grave.

Mr. Boyce is survived by his widow Mary A. Boyce, two daughters, Mrs. Mabel E. Kitchin and Mrs. Eva W. Rollison; a brother, Samuel S. Boyce, and sister, Mary E. Burgess, all of this city, and by a sister, Mrs. Julia A. Dennis, of Beloit, Wis.
