Transferred to Arlington

Remains of John A. Briscoe Reinterred With Honors of the Navy

The remains of John A. Brisco, a retired naval officer, were removed this afternoon from Congressional cemetery to the National Cemetery at Arlington. As an officer he had long and distinguished service during the civil war, dying in this city January 2, 1904. Entering the service as an officer of the United States Navy, March 24, 1858 he was retired from active service in 1888. During his career he served on numerous war vessels, including the Water Witch, Cyane, St. Lawrence, Dale, Ticonderoga, Ossepee, Pensacola, Franklin, Minnesota and Severn; also having charge of the launching of the Constitution when that historic ship was placed on exhibition at the Philadelphia centennial in 1876.

The interment at Arlington was attended by the usual naval honors. His widow, Mrs. M.J. Brisco and a married daughter, Mrs. Agnes V. Bradshaw, both residing in this city, survive him
