His Injuries Fatal

Mr. Edward C. Broughton, who was frightfully injured Monday afternoon by the explosion of a fuse cap, which he was holding between his teeth, died last evening at the Emergency Hospital. The injured man suffered intensely from the time of the accident, and, of course was unable to speak, as his tongue was badly mangled. The remains have been removed to the late residence of the deceased, 3143 N street northwest, where funeral services are to be held tomorrow at 2 o'clock. Mr. Broughton leaves a wife and three children. Coroner Hammett will make an investigation of the case this afternoon at Wright's undertaking establishment to decide whether or not an inquest is necessary.
