**Joseph Bury Succumbs To Disease of Kidneys
Was Among Pioneer Druggists of Washington --
Interment Tomorrow**

Joseph Bury, one of the pioneer druggists of the District, died Wednesday at his residence, 148 11th street southeast, after an illness of two weeks of kidney trouble. Funeral services are to be held tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock at the family home. Rev. F.W. Johnson of Grace Baptist Church is to officiate. Interment is to be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Bury was born in Washington eighty-two years ago. He was one of the first men to open a drug store in the District of Columbia before the civil war and during his life he owned and operated three different establishments. He retired from business in 1900. Mr. Bury was a member of the G.A.R. having served in the District Volunteers during the war.

Seven children, William F. Bury, Mrs. C.C. Wilkison, George B. Bury, Joseph E. Bury, James A. Bury, Mrs. Arthur Keithley and Mrs. Zach Hasel, all of his city, survive him.
