Navy Yard Employee for 24 Years.

Funeral Tomorrow

Charles E. Byrne, for twenty four years employed at the navy yard here, died in Los Amita, Col., May 3. The body was brought to this city, and the funeral is to take place tomorrow at the family home, 433 5th street southeast, at 3 p.m., under the auspices of Lebanon Lodge, No. 7, F.A.A.M. Interment is to be in Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Byrne had been employed at the navy yard since 1890 as a machinist, and by conscientious performance of and strict attention to his duty was promoted through the various grades until he reached the supervisory position of quartermen, which he held at the time of his death. His wife, Mrs. Julia S. Byrne, survives him.
