Dies After Brief Illness

Miss Josephine Byron Contracts Influenza While Attending Sister

While attending her sister, who was ill of influenza, Miss Josephine Byron, teacher of the fourth grade at the Henry D. Cooke School, contracted the disease and died Saturday at her home at the Montclair apartments. The sister, Miss Elizabeth N. Byron survives.

Miss Josephine Byron contracted the disease Thursday and died Saturday night of pneumonia. Besides her service at the Cooke School she had taught at the Force School, and was highly regarded by school officials for her efficient work. Funeral services were held this afternoon at the apartment. Interment was at the Congressional cemetery. Besides the sister, an uncle and cousin living in Massachusetts survive her.
