Death of Carlos Carvalho

The death of Carlos Carvalho, on the 7th instant, occasioned the deepest sorrow to his many friends, and was a profound affliction to his immediate family. He was born at Fort Mackinac, Michigan, December 13, 1873, and was the son of Dr. Carlos Carvalho, U.S.A., and Emma Bayless of the well-known old Washington family. Carlos Carvalho was in the 23rd year of his age. In all the relations of life he was unexceptionally a devoted son and brother. His loss is to those dear ones irreparable. He entered the National Bank of the Republic at an early age, and rose by his merits to a responsible position in that institution. His grandfather, Don Manuel Carvalho, was for years Chilean minister to the United States, and subsequently represented his country at London and Brussels, and was regarded as a most accomplished diplomat. The death of Carlos Carvalho was so unexpected that the announcement of his illness was speedily followed by the intelligence of his death. His remains were laid at rest in the vault of his great-grandfather, James H. Causten, at Congressional cemetery.
