Irving G. Cashell, 82, a veterinarian who owned and operated the Georgetown Veterinary Hospital for 30 years before retiring in 1980, died Nov. 8 at his home in Alexandria. He had cancer.

He was past president of both the Maryland and District Veterinary Medical associations.

Dr. Cashell was born in North Carolina and raised in Washington. He was a graduate of Central High School and the University of Pennsylvania veterinary school.

Before founding his own vet hospital in 1950, where he specialized in the treatment of small animals, he practiced in Wilmington, N.C. He also worked for the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration, supervising the shipment of horses to Europe after World War II.

Survivors include his wife, Joan, of Alexandria; two sons, Dr. Alan W., of Elkins W. Va., and Brian W., of Oakton; and five grandchildren.
