Dr. Cashell Dies; Pioneer Veterinarian

Dr. Irving Magruder Cashell, 65, a pioneer in veterinary medicine, died from a heart condition yesterday at his home, 2807 18th st. nw.

Dr. Cashell operated the Cashell Veterinary Hospital, 2128 L st. nw., from 1928 to 1945 when a stroke forced his retirement. From 1935 to 1945, he was secretary of the District Board of Examiners of Veterinary Medicine. A son, Dr. Irving G. Cashell, now holds that position.

The veterinarian enjoyed Nation-wide prominence both through his work and for his efforts in numerous professional societies to improve the professional status of veterinarians.

A native of Montgomery County, he graduated from Strayer's Business School and earned his veterinary degree from George Washington University in 1914. He did post graduate work in bacteriology at Johns Hopkins University.

Before entering work here, he was a North Carolina health officer and city manager and worked several years with the Agriculture Department's Bureau of Animal Industry.

Besides his son, who lives at 2916 M st. nw., Dr. Cashell is survived by his wife, Mrs. Florence G. Cashell; another son, John G. Cashell, of Schenectady, N.Y.; a daughter, Mrs. Flint Kellogg, of Carlisle, Pa., a brother, Thomas Roland Cashell, of Silver Spring; and two grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Monday at 10:30 a.m. at the Hysong Funeral Home, 1300 N st. nw., with private burial services following in Congressional Cemetery.
