#### Death of Mrs. Mary J. Crawford.

Mrs. Mary J. Crawford, a resident of Anacostia for the last twenty-wo years, died Saturday night at 10 o'clock in Providence Hospital, where she had been removed for treatment for a fractured hip, the injury having been received a her late home, 13 Jefferson street, Anacostia, recently. Mrs. Crawford was in her eighty-fifth year and was stated to have been the oldest woman resident of the town. She was a native of the District, where she lived her entire life, and was the widow of Adam Crawford, who was a widely known resident of East Washington.

The deceased had been living with Mrs. Eliza Gousha, a daughter, a 13 Jefferson street, and during a number of months lately had been ill. She was recovering, however, when one day she accidentally fell, sustaining a severe fracture of one of her hips, to which injury her death is directly attributed. Two daughters and five sons survive her. They are Mrs. Emma Bloomer, Mrs. Eliza Gousha, George Crawford, James Crawford, William Crawford, Charles Crawford, now of Baltimore, and Samuel Crawford of Phoebus, Va. It is proposed to have her five sons act as pallbearers at the funeral, which will take place Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock from her late residence, 13 Jefferson street. Rev. Charles O. Isaac, the pastor of the Anacostia Methodist Episcopal Church, will officiate. The interment will be made in Congressional cemetery.
