## **Eugene A. Curry Dies**

## Former P.O. and Treasury Employe Passes Away, Aged 87

Eugene A. Curry, a veteran of the civil war and for thirty-five years an employe of the Post Office and Treasury departments, died at the residence of his son, 625 A street northeast, yesterday at the age of eighty-seven. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at his son's home. Interment will be at Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Curry was born in New York city in 1830, the son of Capt. E.L. and Elvira S. Curry, members of a family whose ancestors fought in the revolutionary war. He served three years in the civil war as a member of the 50th New York Engineers and came to Washington in 1875, entering the employ of the Post Office Department, later being transferred to the Treasury Department. He resigned in 1910 owing to ill health.

Mr. Curry was a member of Kit Carson Post, No. 1, G.A.R. He is survived by his son, Elmer E. Curry, and two sisters, Mrs. D.P. Budd of Valois, New York and Mrs. A. LaMoreaux of Penn Yan, New York.
