## J.L. Custer Drowned Swimming In River

Joseph L. Custer, thirty years old, 2214 I street, was drowned while swimming in the river between Fort Foote and River View, Md., yesterday afternoon.

Custer accompanied a number of friends on a motorboat trip to a point some distance below Alexandria yesterday, and while several members of the party were swimming he suddenly disappeared beneath the surface of the water.

Friends made unsuccessful efforts to rescue him and later failed in a search for the body. Custer was a splendid swimmer, it is stated, and friends think the accident resulted from cramps. James W. Orme, one of his employes, today accompanied police of the harbor to the scene. Police this afternoon are dragging for his body.
