Carpenter Killed In 45-Foot Fall

Clement T. Dant, 65, Slips From Scaffold at Academy of Sciences

Falling from a scaffold forty-five feet high in the new home of the National Academy of Sciences, 21st and B streets northwest, yesterday afternoon, Clement T. Dant, a carpenter, was instantly killed.

Mr. Dant was sixty-five years old and resided at 804 4-1/2 street. He was working on the interior of the dome and fell through to the central hall on the ground floor. Workmen rushed to his side and summoned an ambulance, but Dant was pronounced dead by the physician.
