Masons To Conduct L.A. Dellwig Rites Native of Germany, 96, Had Lived Here 72 Years -- Funeral Tomorrow Afternoon

Funeral services for Louis A. Dellwig, sr., veteran Mason and retired groceryman, who died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Flora D. Trueman at Bethesda, Md., Wednesday, will be held in Zurhorst's funeral parlors, 301 East Capitol street, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. Dr. John Weidley, pastor of the Reformation Lutheran Church, will officiate. The services will be in charge of the Masons.

Mr. Dellwig would have been 96 years old tomorrow and had been a resident of this city for 72 years. He went to live with his daughter at Bethesda, Md., last June.

He has been a member of the Masonic Fraternity since 1858 and belonged to Naval Lodge, No. 4, F.A.A.M. A native of Germany, Mr. Dellwig came to this country when 22 years old. He retired from the grocery business about 25 years ago.

He is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Trueman; a son, Louis A. Dellwig, jr., of this city, and a sister, Mrs. Emma Ehrenpfort of Oakland, Calif.
