## Charles C. Dunn, 84, Retired Teacher, Dies

Charles Comiskey Dunn, 84, who served both as a Government instrument maker and an industrial arts teacher, died yesterday of a heart attack in his home at 2506 Valley drive, Alexandria.

Mr. Dunn began his career as a builder of model ships at the Navy Yard here in 1900. He became an industrial arts teacher in 1912, and taught at the old Manual Trade School on Massachusetts avenue N.E. until the outbreak of World War I.

Mr. Dunn worked through the war as a munitions expert in Baltimore and Woodbridge, N.J. for the Army Ordnance Corps.

After the war he returned to Washington and became an instrument maker for the Coast and Geodetic Survey. Completing more than 20 years of Federal Government service, he retired at age 65 shortly before World War II.

With the Washington public schools facing a wartime teacher shortage, Mr. Dunn returned to teaching, and continued until he was 75.

As a young man Mr. Dunn was an outstanding athlete with the old Washington Light Infantry's teams and in the Corcoran Cadets. In later years he was an officer in the Industrial Arts Society of Northern Virginia, a member of St. John's Masonic Lodge, and a vestryman in St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Alexandria.

He leaves his son, Godwin P. Dunn, of the home address; a sister, Mrs. Harry Buell, of 5304 Sharon lane, Stan Haven, Md., three grandsons, and two great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be Tuesday at 11 a.m. in the Everly-Wheatley Funeral Home, Alexandria, with burial in Congressional Cemetery.
