Death of Hon. Charles Eames

On Saturday morning, Hon. Charles Eames died at his late residence on H Street, in the fifty-fifth year of his age. Mr. Eames was one of the most distinguished members of the bar, and was well and favorably known at the bars of the U.S. Supreme Court and of our District courts. He was a native of Massachusetts, and a graduate of Harvard College, and during his life held several important positions of trust, among others that of U.S. Minister to Venezuela and U.S. Commissioner to the Sandwich Islands. His funeral will take place at noon tomorrow.

Funeral of Hon. Charles Eames

The funeral of the late Hon. Chas. Eames took place at noon yesterday, from his late residence, corner of 14th and H Streets, and was very largely attended, a number of members of Congress, with Assistant Attorney General Ashton and Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Chandler, and a number of prominent citizens being present. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Dr. P.D. Guriev, of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, and the remains were interred in the Congressional Cemetery.
