
Richard Jackson Earnshaw

RICHARD J. EARNSHAW.

Richard J. Earnshaw, for forty-five years a resident and business man of Washington, died Tuesday at his home, 1225 Clifton street. The funeral was held from his home this afternoon, members of the Association of Oldest Inhabitants, Masons and business associates attending.

He was born in Prince George's county, Md., in 1852, and came to Washington forty-five years ago, when he opened a mercantile brokerage business, which is today one of the city's largest. Gaining fortune in the commercial world, Mr. Earnshaw became director of several banking institutions, among which are the Continental Trust Company and the Commerce and Savings Bank, of which he was vice president. He was an Odd Fellow and a Shriner, and also a vestry man of St. Andrew's and St. Mark's churches.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Alice King Earnshaw, and six children; Mrs. Robert H. Martin of Atlanta, Ga.; Mrs. John M. Couden of Baltimore, Miss Margaret C., George V., Pinkney A. and Robert J., the latter being with the overseas forces.
