Harry James Eckstein Jr., 51, a Northern Virginia businessman and Falls Church resident, died March 8 at a hospital in Williamsburg. He had a heart ailment.

Mr. Eckstein, who was in Williamsburg on vacation, was born in Washington. He was a graduate of Montgomery Blair High School in Silver Spring.

Since 1967, he had been owner and president of several businesses. These included the Book and Card Shop in Falls Church; the Old Town News, which was an Alexandria newsstand; and Best Continental Book, a Merrifield book distributorship. Before starting his own businesses, he had worked in distribution here for the District News company and Fawcett Publishing.
