Madeline Winn Eckstein, 67, a mathematics teacher at Belt Junior High School in Wheaton for 20 years before retiring in 1975, died of cancer Saturday in her home in Silver Spring.

She was the 1965 recipient of the Master Teacher Award presented by Wheaton High School's Future Teachers of America.

Mrs. Eckstein was a charter member of Christ Congregational Church in Silver Spring. She was a member of the American Association of University Women.

She was born in Richmond, came to Washington in the 1930s, and had made her home in Silver Spring since 1939. Mrs. Eckstein was a 1934 graduate of Greensboro College in North Carolina.
