D.W. Edelin Dead; Funeral Tomorrow Drafting Division Chief of Patent Office Succumbs Yesterday at Garfield Hospital Masonic Funeral Planned

Temple-Noyes Lodge Will Conduct Rites at Grave

Daniel Whiting Edelin, chief of the drafting division of the United States patent office, and connected with that office for forty-two years, died at 4:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon at Garfield Hospital after an illness of about two months.

A native of Prince Georges county, Md., where he was born January 24, 1863, Mr. Edelin spent most of his life in this city, being prominent and popular in official, fraternal and social positions. He was a grandson of the late Col. James N. Edelin, United States Marine Corps, and the son of the late Col. T. Boyd Edelin and Isabella Whiting Edelin.

Mr. Edelin is survived by his wife, Mrs. Hattie A. Edelin; Mrs. Isabelle Lewis, a daughter; Alden Boyd Edelin, a son; Mrs. Mary E. Grimeley and Miss Margaret Edelin, sisters, and J.N. Edelin, a brother.

The deceased was an active and enthusiastic member of Temple-Noyes Lodge, No. 32, F.A.A.M., and of Mount Pleasant Chapter, No. 13, ,R.A.M. He rarely, if ever, failed to attend a meeting of the lodge.

Mr. Edelin of late years resided at the Biltmore, 19th and Biltmore streets. Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, 3017 14th street, Rev. Dr. George F. Dudley, the rector, officiating. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Temple-Noyes Lodge will take charge, following the services at the church, and conduct the burial, in accordance with Masonic custom.

John J. Boobar, the master, has called a special communication of the lodge for 1 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in lodgeroom No. 2, Masonic Temple, 13th street and New York avenue. John G. Hodges, high priest of Mount Pleasant chapter, will attend the funeral as official representative of the chapter.

The pallbearers will be Adolph Gude, Ralph P. Barnard, Joshua B. Callahan, W.W. Bower and Charles T. Clagett, all members of Temple-Noyes Lodoge, and Charles J. O'Neill, past grand master of Masons, who was a close personal friend of the deceased during most of his career in Washington.
