Will of George Einolf

Last Wishes Regarding the Distribution of His Estate

The will of the late George Einolf, dated October 11, 1897, and a codicil thereto, dated January 15, 1898, has been filed for probate with the register of wills. By the terms of the two instruments all of the testator's property, real and personal, is conveyed in trust to Henry Schlosser of Baltimore and the late William Redin Woodward of this city. The property, when converted into cash, is to be distributed as follows:

To Louise Loeffler, \$100; to Louise Cook, \$100; to Catharine Dittrich and Caroline Davison of Baltimore, \$100; to the heirs of the testator's deceased wife's brother, George Dickel, Berlebrg, Germany, \$200; to a nephew, Philip Gehb, a deaf mute, \$1,000; to Justina Einolf, \$100; to Jacob Emmich, \$100. The sum of \$250 shall be sent to the burgomaster of Bieden-Kopf, testator's native town, in Germany, for distribution among the poor.

The residue of his estate is to be divided in four equal parts among his sister Katharine Gehb, Baltimore, the heirs of his sister Mary Young, Richmond; the heirs of his brother August Einolf, and his sister Elisa Krieh, both of the latter residing in Germany.
