

Final Rites Tomorrow For W.W. Eldridge

Funeral services for Watson W. Eldridge, chief of the division of issue, Treasury Department, who Friday morning ended his life with a pistol in his apartment at the Evanston, 3427 13<sup>th</sup> street, will take place at his late home tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, under the auspices of the G.A.R. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery the services there being conducted by Pentalpha Lodge, No. 23, F.A.A>M.

Coroner Nevitt visited the Eldridge residence Friday afternoon, made an investigation and gave a certificate showing Mr. Eldridge was suffering from mental depression, indicating that he was not wholly responsible for his act.

Mr. Eldridge was under treatment for an attack of the grip, Dr. Nevitt was informed, and was despondent. He had brooded over the death of a sister, it was stated, although he had never made any suggestion of self-destruction.

Mr. Eldridge was a member of Pentalpha Lodge, No. 23, F.A.A.M.; Mount Vernon Chapter, R.A.M., and Columbia Commandery, K.T.
