Mrs. Kate Evans Dies After Street Accident

Injury by Car Last Tuesday Proves Fatal -- Funeral to Be Held Saturday

Mrs. Kate C. Evans, fifty-three years old, 1348 Girard street, who was severely injured by a street car at 6th and C streets northeast Tuesday afternoon, died at Casualty Hospital early this morning. Coroner Nevitt will conduct an inquest at the morgue tomorrow afternoon.

Mrs. Evans is survived by her husband Richard P. Evans, member of the bar and prominent in Masonic circles, and five sons and two daughters. The sons are Lieut. Richard T. Evans, U.S.A.; John P., George W. and Edwin F. Evans of this city and Frank W.S. Evans of Baltimore. Mrs. Joseph Guernsey, Orlando, Fla., and Miss Mary E.M. Evans are the daughters. The deceased was native of Hyattsville, Md., but had resided in this city most of her life. She was prominently identified with religious work in Calvary Methodist Church, and Rev. John T. Ensor a former pastor, will officiate at her funeral Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
