Veteran Machinist, 42 Years in Navy Yard, Succumbs

William Ewin, veteran machinist at the Washington navy yard, died yesterday at his home, 1018 South Carolina avenue southeast, following an illness of three years. The funeral will be held from the family residence tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. J. Curtis White, rector of Christ Protestant Episcopal Church, officiating. The interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Mr. Ewin was a native of Baltimore. He located in this city in 1864, just before the close of the civil war. In 1878 he went to the navy yard as a first-class machinist and was continuously engaged there at his trade for forty-two years. He was retired in 1920. He was eighty-three years old.
