A native of Washington and a graduate of the George Washington Medical School, Dr. Fisher had engaged in local practice for more than 20 years. He was a member of the B.B. French Masonic Lodge, the Shriners and the American Medical Association.

Services Will Be Held This Afternoon From Late Home

Funeral services for Dr. Raymond A. Fisher, 47 years old, who died Monday at the residence, 505 B street northeast, will be held at 2 o'clock this afternoon from the residence. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Born in Washington, Dr. Fisher was educated in Eastern High School and George Washington University Medical School. He had practiced continuously since his graduation from the medical school in 1905. He was a member of the B.B. French Masonic Lodge, the Shriners and the American Medical Association. He was also an elder of the Metropolitan Presbyterian Church. Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Bullough Fisher, and two sons, Raymond A. Fisher and Watson van Ness Fisher. Dr. Fisher was the son of the late William and Mattie Fisher.
