## Sudden Death of Bladen Forrest

Mr. Bladen Forrest, who, for nearly forty years past, has been a resident of Georgetown, died suddenly of apoplexy, at 9 o'clock last evening, at his residence, on the corner of 1st and Frederick streets. The deceased was sixty-one years of age and was the proprietor of the well-known "Forrest Hall." He was enjoying a smoke, and his pipe falling to the floor was broken; whereupon he went to the mantel and taking another charged it with tobacco, but, before he lighted a match for the purpose of continuing his smoke he was taken quite sick, and was assisted to a chair, and from thence to a lounge, upon which he died in about half an hour, although medical attendance was promptly summoned. He had suffered from attacks of the same kind previously, and on this occasion did not seem to be aware of immediate danger, as he consoled his relatives around him with the opinion that nothing serious would ensue.
