A graduate of George Washington University, Dr. Fowler was a member of Psi Omega fraternity there. Later he joined Columbia Lodge No. 3, F.A.A.M.; Knights Templar, and Almas Temple.

For 30 years Dr. Fowler had an office in the Westory Building at 605 14th st. nw. He moved his office to his home in 1940, where he practiced until the time of his death.

Dr. R.C. Fowler, 45 Years A Practicing Dentist Here

Dr. Robert C. Fowler of 811 East Capitol street, who practiced dentistry here for 45 years, died of a cerebral hemorrhage Thursday at Providence Hospital. Dr. Fowler was born in the Capitol Hill area and lived there all of his life.

He practiced in the Westory Building at 605 Fourteenth street N.W. for 30 years, then moved his office to his home in 1940, where he practiced until his death.

Dr. Fowler was a graduate of George Washington University and a member of Psi Omega Fraternity there.

He belonged to Columbia Lodge No. 3, FAAM, Knights Templar, and Almas Temple, and was a life member of Anacostia Chapter No. 12, Royal Arch Masons.
