Police Sergeant Dies

James Frank of Eleventh Precinct Closely Follows Wife

James Frank, desk sergeant at the eleventh precinct station, died at his home, 439 12th street southeast, early this morning. His wife died only a few days ago, and, it is stated, he suffered a nervous collapse shortly after her death. His last illness probably was brought on by loss or rest while nursing his wife.

The deceased was a native of Virginia and seventy years old. He served one enlistment in the United States Cavalry in the sixties, and was appointed to the position of stationkeeper in the police department October 18, 1884. His brother, the late John A. Frank, served as sanitary officer in the police department for a number of years.

Mrs. Frank, the first wife of the deceased, died many years ago, and her body was interred in Congressional cemetery, this city, while that of his second wife, who was a native of Baltimore, was buried in that city. The deceased is survived by two sons, Luther and Andrew.
