F.R. Franzoni Dies; Retired Employe of Surgeon General

Fred Royce Franzoni, sr., 70, who served in the Army Surgeon General's Office for 49 years before his retirement in 1947, died Thursday at his home, 1712 Taylor street N.W. He had been ill for several weeks.

Mr. Franzoni was a lifelong resident of Washington and attended the Business High School before entering the Surgeon General's Office. At the time he retired he was chief of its general service branch.

During the early part of his career he was in charge of a medical supply exhibit for an international meeting of the Association of Military Surgeons. In World War I he was chief clerk of the Field Medical Supply Depot here. Shortly afterwards he was given a captaincy in the Medical Regiment of the Officers Reserve Corps, a commission he held for 15 years.
