James A. Frazier Dies

Clerk in Treasury Department Passes Away at Home of Son-in-Law

James A. Frazier, for several years a clerk in the Treasury Department, died yesterday at the home of his son-in-law, Gail T. Judd, 731 Kentucky avenue. Funeral services are to be held at the residence at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, and interment is to be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Frazier, who was fifty-nine years old, was born in this city and always lived here. He was a member of Columbia Lodge, No. 3, of Masons and was past deputy national councilor of the Junior Order of American Mechanics. He also served in the Marine Corps.

He is survived by his wife and five children, Mrs. Lillian Judd, Mrs. Eva Sylvester, Miss Grace Frazier and Charles and William Frazier, all of this city.
