Funeral services for William P. Fuse, who died in Emergency Hospital last Thursday of injuries suffered when struck by a bus, will be held at 2:30 p.m. tomorrow from the Perry & Walsh funeral home, 29 H Street Northwest. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Fuse, who was 76, was Washington's twenty-second traffic victim this year.
