Miss Rachel A. Garrett Died Tuesday at Saranac Lake, N.Y.

Miss Rachel A. Garrett one of the best known teachers in the Washington public schools, died Tuesday afternoon at Saranac Lake, N.Y., where she was spending her summer vacation. Her death was due to nervous exhaustion.

Miss Garrett was a daughter of the late George W. Garrett. She was about fifty-two year old and had been a teacher in the Washington schools for thirty years, her assignment last year being at the Amidon building. She made her home in this city with her cousins, Mr. and Mrs. C.C. Mothershead, at 718 B street southwest. Her nearest surviving relative is a sister, Miss Margaret E. Garrett, also a teacher, who was with her at the time of her death. It is expected the remains will arrive here this afternoon. No arrangements have yet been made for the funeral. Miss Garret was a prominent member of the Marvin M.E. Church South, and was active in charitable work.
