Woman Dies, Poison Evidence Is Sought

Frances Gertman, Taken From U.S. Hotels May 29, Expires at Hospital

Frances Gertman, 42, who was removed from her home at the Government Hotels to Emergency Hospital on May 29, believed to be suffering from a self-administered dose of poison, died at the hospital early today.

Following her admission to the hospital it was thought that she was suffering mental disorders, and police were making arrangements for her commitment for tests as to her sanity when she died. The evidence of poisoning were so inconsiderable that a definite opinion of physicians at the hospital to the effect that she had not taken poison was entered on police books.

Acting Coroner Joseph D. Rogers will view the body today. She is survived by two brothers.
