Mrs. A. Estelle Gill, former teacher in the Washington schools, died yesterday at the home of her sister, Mrs. Gertrude Ruff, 2310 First street. She was the wife of Rev. John M. Gill, former pastor of Rhode Island Methodist Protestant Church here and present pastor of West Baltimore M.P. Church.

Mrs. Gill taught in the public schools here about 20 years prior to her marriage, in 1909. She had lived in Baltimore since 1915, after having resided in Seattle, Wash. About six years.

Besides her husband she is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Ruff and Miss Eva Crump of Washington, and a stepson, Col. Robert J. Gill of Baltimore.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in the West Baltimore Church, followed by burial in Congressional Cemetery here.
