Frank B. Gilmore, Former Banker, Dies

Well Known Figure in Financial and Business Circles of City Claimed By Death

Frank Buchanan Gilmore widely known in financial and business circles in this city, died at his residence, 3701 Massachusetts avenue, early today.

Born in Philadelphia, October 21, 1864, Mr. Gilmore came to this city in 1880. After lengthy service with the Bank of Washington, he left to become cashier of the Burnside National Bank, Burnside, Pa. He remained there for two years and returned to this city due to failing health.

He was a member of Harmony Lodge, No. 17, F.A.A.M., and Mount Vernon Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, and was a member of the Dumbarton Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Nellie Prout Gilmore a son, John Prout Gilmore of this city a brother, Col. J. Campbell Gilmore of Philadelphia and a sister, Miss Elizabeth Long Gilmore of Washington.
