Christian P. Gliem Dies Was Capitol Engineer

Government Employe for Thirty-Two Years -- Was Born in Philadelphia

Christian P. Gliem, for thirty-two years chief electrical engineer of the United States Capitol, died yesterday afternoon at his apartment, in the Congressional, 1st and East Capitol streets, after an illness of eight weeks.

Mr. Gliem was born in Philadelphia fifty-eight years ago. He came to Washington thirty-two years ago and assumed the position as chief electrical engineer at the Capitol. He was a member of Robert A. Lamberton Lodge, No. 487 F.A.A.M. of Philadelphia Washington Chapter, No. 2, R.A.M. Washington Commandery, No 1, K.T. the Mystic Shrine, and of the Washington Society of Engineers.

His widow, Mrs. Eva N. Gliem, a son, Christian L. Gliem, and a daughter, Mrs. Eugene C. Cassidy, survive him.

Funeral services are to be held at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at Zurhorst's undertaking parlors, 301 East Capitol Street. Canon Austin will assist in the services, which will be conducted by the Masons. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
