Mrs. Sarah A. Goodall, descendant of Carter Braxton, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, died suddenly yesterday of a heart attack. She was 74.

Mrs. Goodall was a former member of Washington Centennial, Order of the Eastern Star, and Independence Council, Daughters of America.

Her husband, A. Lincoln Goodall, of 504 Maryland Ave. S.W., and three sisters, Mrs. Ida J. Warren, Mrs. Mary J. Balderson, and Mrs. Miriam Rowzee, all of this city, survive.

Goodall Funeral Rites Are Being Held Today

Member of Old Capital Family Died of Heart Attack on Monday

Mrs. Sarah A. Goodall, 74, member of an old Washington family, who died Monday of a heart attack at her home, 504 Maryland avenue S.W., will be buried today in Congressional Cemetery. Funeral services are being held this afternoon in Lee's funeral home, Fourth street and Massachusetts avenue N.E.

Mrs. Goodall was a descendant of Carter Braton, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. She had resided all her life in the Southwest section. Her parents were the late John P. and Mary Braxton. She was a granddaughter of John Tucker, reputedly the first mailman in the old Southwest section, known as "the Island."

She was a former member of the Washington Centennial Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, and the Independence Council of the Daughters of America.

Surviving are her husband, A. Lincoln Goodall, and three sisters, Mrs. Ida J. Warren, Mrs. Mary J. Balderson and Mrs. Miriam Rowzee, all of this city.
